Rental safety information and instruction:

1. Setup

- Location for equipment setup must be level and free from rocks or debris. (no more than a 5° incline is allowed)
- Location for equipment setup must not have any underground sprinkler system, or other known buried objects or utilities. Anchoring stakes are a minimum of 18" long and go deep into the ground. The lessee or using party assumes full responsibility for any underground obstruction that may be hit by a stake. (See the Liability release section, which will also apply to this instance).
- If the area for setup is un-suitable for staking, sandbags may be used for anchors at an additional charge.
- Every inflatable has at least 4 anchor points. Anchor devices (stakes/sandbags) MUST be left in place and untouched. Under no circumstances are they to be moved or removed.
- Every inflatable has at least one (sometimes multiple) inflation tube(s) connected to a blower unit(s). These tubes must NOT be removed from the blower unit(s).
- Inflatable units are not to be moved or removed from the location originally placed by Spokane Bounce representative/driver.
- An electricity outlet or outlets must be available near the desired setup location. (Within 50') and be a dedicated circuit without other appliances running on the same circuit. (If electricity is not available at the site a generator may be used provided it 4000 Watt rated power.) A GFCI outlet is highly recommended.
- Only extension cords provided by Spokane Bounce should be used with this unit. Never should the blower be used with an extension cord greater than 50' in length.
- The motor/blower needs to be left on and running at ALL TIMES.
- If using a water unit, the lessee or using party must provide their own water source to reach the equipment being used.



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- If inflatable unit is being used in a public or government owned park/facility/site the lessee is responsible to obtain ANY and ALL permits and pay ANY and ALL usage fees associated with the use of an inflatable in said locations. (By initialing below you state that you HAVE complied with permitting/fees associated.) Should any fines or fees be assessed or incurred for placement on/in said locations, lessee/user agrees to pay and fulfill any fines/fees/penalties incurred for such violation.

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2. Usage - Supervision

- An ADULT must be in attendance and supervising the use of equipment at ALL Times that the equipment is in the possession of the lessee or using party. The Lessee or using party is responsible to provide the ADULT supervision required while the rental equipment is in the possession of the lessee.
- The supervising ADULT must read and understand the safety plaque and follow it's stated rules at all times.
- The supervising ADULT must stand in a location where they can view all users and pay attention to the users/jumpers at all times.
- Under no circumstances should a Spokane Bounce inflatable rental be used without a supervising ADULT present.
- The lessee/supervising adult must perform a walk-around safety inspection once every ½ hour per Spokane Bounce Instructions to ensure everything is connected and operating correctly at all times.

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3. Usage-Bouncers/Riders

- NO sharp objects (including keys/eyeglasses/necklaces/footwear) are allowed inside or on any of Spokane Bounce Inflatables at any time.
- No one who might have physical problems, or who is under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs may use Spokane Bounce's Inflatable Rentals.
- The number/weight/height requirements for users listed on the safety plaque must not be exceeded. Users must also be of the same physical size and ages.
- NO single user may exceed the 200lb weight capacity.



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- Users must be wearing appropriate attire to avoid skin burns (this includes socks on dry units).
- Users must not participate in any rough-housing or wild behavior. (Absolutely NO flips or aggressive behavior should be tolerated). Users must not sit down or lie down in an inflatable while others are jumping around them. Injury may occur.
- ALL inflatable units operated by Spokane Bounce are meant for bouncing or sliding ONLY and may NEVER be used for tricks, wrestling, flips, somersaults, or rough-housing of ANY kind EVER.
- Users must not jump against the sides or try to climb any netting or other safety equipment.
- Users must not play in/on entrance or exit ramps.
- Absolutely NO food or drink (or gum!) is allowed in/on any of the inflatable units.
- Absolutely NO pets are allowed in/on any of the inflatable units.
- Silly string (and similar items) ruin vinyl. If Silly String comes in contact with the inflatable you have rented you will be charged for repair or replacement. Under NO circumstances should silly string be allowed in/on/near any of Spokane Bounce's Inflatables.
- Users of slides wet or dry must follow proper sliding techniques shown on safety plaques (feet first). Absolutely NO jumping off of slides.
- Users of slides must Not slide double (or with a child). Injury may occur!
- Face Paint should be avoided when using Spokane Bounce equipment. Face Paint may leave stains on the vinyl (for which a cleaning/repair charge would be assessed).
- Inflatables should not be used in inclement weather. Anytime there is lightning present or winds become excessive (20mph) the inflatable should be deflated. If renting a dry unit, you must ensure the unit has been fully dried (after precipitation) before allowing any users to re-enter the unit.

We take safety Very Seriously, and believe you should be vigilant also. Any user not following the rules should be instructed to exit the inflatable immediately. If at any time you feel you cannot provide proper supervision you should stop using the product and call Spokane Bounce immediately for a pickup. (No refund will be issued).

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4. Emergency Procedures-Troubleshooting

- If the inflatable begins to deflate for any reason, DO NOT PANIC. Simply direct ALL users of the inflatable to quickly (but calmly) exit the inflatable. If someone becomes trapped inside of a deflated unit, direct someone to attempt to re-inflate the unit while you help the user out of the inflatable.
- Should the unit start to deflate you MUST have everyone exit the unit and troubleshoot the reason the unit has begun to deflate. This is most often caused by one of these reasons:
 - i. Electricity has stopped working.
 - 1. The blower(s) power cord (s) may have become unplugged. (Check the extension cord(s) too!)
 - 2. A circuit breaker or GFCI may have popped if other appliances are using the same circuit the inflatable is plugged into.
 - 3. The blower(s) power switch may have been turned off.
 - 4. If using a generator, it may have been shut off, or run out of gas.
 - 5. If a representative from Spokane Bounce is called out to troubleshoot a power failure (and it turns out to be one of the above mentioned items, or a utility power failure) and it's deemed to Not be the fault of any Spokane Bounce Equipment then a \$75 service fee shall apply.
 - ii. Blower is on but not producing much air.
 - 1. Check that no leaves or debris have blocked the blower unit's intake.
 - 2. Check that the inflation tube has not become separated from the blower unit.
 - iii. Inflatable doesn't seem to be holding air even though blower seems to be working fine.
 - 1. Some inflatables have zippers or Velcro openings to assist in deflation. Check to ensure none of these have inadvertently been opened. (Your Spokane Bounce Representative will inform you as to if and where your rented unit has these openings during instruction.)

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- If you are having ANY issues with deflation, or ANY other issues (and you are unable to troubleshoot them) you are responsible to call Spokane Bounce immediately to report the trouble and ask for assistance.
- Should an accident or injury occur you will dial 911 in an emergency situation, and then immediately contact Spokane Bounce to report the incident.
- Lessee/user agrees to collect the information of any/all participants/witnesses involved in the incident and pass this information over to the Spokane Bounce representative at the time of reporting.
- Lessee/user agrees to communicate to the Spokane Bounce representative ANY/ALL incidents that have occurred during the rental period (no matter how small).
- Lessee/user agrees to inform Spokane Bounce representative about ANY/ALL issues that they had, noticed, or incurred with the equipment during their rental period.

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5. Release of Liability

- Lessee/User agrees to accept full responsibility for the use/operation of all rented equipment.
- The Lessee/User(s) voluntarily releases, indemnifies, and agrees to hold harmless and discharge Spokane Bounce (including it's owner Karl Gartman and any/all employees or agents from Spokane Bounce), from any and all liability claims, demands, actions or rights of actions, whether personal to itself or to a third party, which are related to, arise out of, or are in any way connected with the rental of the interactive inflatable unit including those allegedly attributable to negligent acts or omissions. The Lessee agrees to reimburse any reasonable attorney's fees and cost, which may be incurred by Spokane Bounce (or any of it's associated owners/employees/agents/entities) in the defense of any such liability claim, demand, action or right of action.
- In the event that the Lessee files a cause of action against Spokane Bounce (or it's owners/employees/agents/entities), the Lessee agrees to do so solely in the State of Washington, and further agrees that the substantive law of that state shall apply in that action without regard to the conflict of law rules of that state. The Lessee agrees that if any portion of this agreement is found to be void or unenforceable, the remaining portions shall remain in full force and effect.



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- Lessee acknowledges and represents that it has adequate homeowner's insurance, tenant insurance, or OTHER liability insurance to cover any bodily injury or property damage, which might occur to itself, its guest, or its invitees from the use of the unit being rented or else agrees to bear the cost of defense and liability of any such injury or damage itself. The Lessee also waives the right of its insurance company to bring any type of action or proceeding on behalf of the lessee against Spokane Bounce (or it's owner/employees/agents/entities) whether by assignment of claim, subrogation or otherwise
